


Key Vocabulary	
Crucifixion	Referring to the death of Jesus on a cross. A Roman punishment.
Easter Sunday	The most important day for Christians when Jesus rose from the dead.
Good Friday	The day that Jesus died. The day he was tried by Pontius Pilate and crucified on Golgotha Hill.
Holy Week	The last week of Jesus' earthly life, starting on Palm Sunday.
Hope	A feeling of expectation and a desire for something to happen.
Eucharist	Holy Communion or Lord's Supper; in Christianity, ritual commemoration of Jesus' Last Supper with his disciples.
Maunday Thursday	The day before Good Friday; the day of the Last Supper.
Palm Sunday	Commemorates Jesus' entry into Jerusalem and is the start of Holy Week.
Sacrifice	The act of giving something up for something more important.
Salvation	The act of saving or being saved.
Resurrection	Christians believe Jesus rose from the dead and became "Christ", the risen one, the Messiah.
