Khalsa Sikh	A group of Sikhs which demonstrate their devotion to the religion with the five K's.
Gurdwara	The Sikhi religious building
Simran	The continuous remembrance of God.
Sewa	The dedication that a Sikh has to their religion: physical service, mental service and material service.
Sarbat Da Bhala	A statement that is repeated by all Sikhs at least twice daily which means 'blessings for everyone'.


- There are three kind of Sikhs; Sahajdhari,

- Gurus are inspirational teachers that show the right way







